Fall 2023 Ministry Report

As the leaves change in autumn, so the Lord brings us into new seasons of life and ministry. Those of you who are active in any ministry, church, or nonprofit will understand that more often than not you are short on at least one of the following: funding, workers, time, or all of the above. During my involvement in various ministry settings, I have witnessed limitations in each of these areas, and CLC is no exception. During the spring semester, we were short on staff, yet we had many people—our staff, volunteers, and board members—who gave of themselves to continue the work of CLC’s ministry even without a full team in place. During that time, I clung to Matthew 9:35-38 as I prayed about our need for a teacher and ministry assistant. I encourage you to read the passage for yourself now. Then, turn to the beginning of chapter 10 and notice how Jesus’ instructions to pray for workers in the harvest field was immediately followed by Him sending out the Twelve to do ministry in His name.

I believe that this generation of students is bombarded by various false ideologies, technology overwhelm, and relational disconnect. On their own, they truly are “harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd,” just as Jesus witnessed in His own generation. Thankfully, His desire was and still is to proclaim the good news of the Kingdom and heal them of their brokenness, and He uses us as His ambassadors.

In previous seasons of asking for more “workers in the field,” I have prayed with a sense of desperation and lack. I have focused on “The workers are few” (with a panicked attitude). But here’s something I’ve learned about Jesus: He was never panicked nor did He make empty promises. What if I believed that the Lord of the harvest is actually able and willing to send out workers, as He does in Matthew 10 following the end of chapter 9? This spring, we began to pray that God would do the sending of workers to shepherd His flock and reap a harvest at the Christian Learning Center and throughout Campbell County. Over the summer, we reviewed applications, conducted interviews, and, thanks to your generous support and prayers, were able to hire two great new staff members: Ronnie Miller as our teacher and Joy Longmire as our ministry assistant. These two individuals have done a wonderful job at ministering to students in the CLC classroom and beyond, and we praise God for their participation in His work.
